Hereby announces to scientists and professionals in the area of law the

OPEN COMPETITION

For sending and publishing of written reports for the Twenty third Conference organized by the Kopaonik School to be held from 13 to 17 December, 2010 under the permanent title Justice and Law. The general theme for this year Conference is

LAW AND SPACE **Harmonization and the right to difference**

Within the framework of this general theme the candidates taking part in the competition are free to choose the topic of their interest encompassed by the areas listed in the subsequent text. The topic chosen may be elaborated from the standpoint of one or of several disciplines of law.

The decision on accepting and publishing the reports shall be made by the Editorial Board, that will also make the decision regarding the kind of author's remuneration which may be of two kinds: the paid sojourn in a hotel in Mt. Kopaonik during the Conference days, including travel expenses and the exemption from paying the participation fee, or only the payment of author's royalties without the paid sojourn. A certain number of reports will be published by invitation.

Open Competition Requirements: the size of reports should be up to 16 double-spaced pages, typed correctly or done on PC. Footnotes, too, should be typed double-spaced and positioned at the end of the text.

Authors are obliged to indicate their name and surname, professional title and occupation, complete address, contact telephone or fax number. The authors are also invited to add a summary to their reports, written in correct English language, which may not exceed one complete page with usual double spacing. Without such information and without meeting the above requirements, the manuscripts shall not be taken in consideration.

Deadline for sending the manuscripts is August 25, 2010, while for foreign authors September 25, 2010. We would appreciate sending the manuscripts even prior to the indicated deadline.

Areas in which it is possible to take part in the Competition make the traditional Hexagon of the Kopaonik School of Natural Law, and include:

- I. Right to Life (life, health, ecology, sports);
- II. Right to Freedom (freedom of thought and expression, freedom of personality, freedom of movement, freedom of religion, criminal-law and procedural protection of personality);
- III. Right to Property (codification, ownership and other property rights, inheritance, denationalization, privatization, taxes and taxation policy, immovable property, contract and tort liability, commercial companies, commercial contracts, banks and banking transactions, insurance, labor relations);
- IV. Right to Intellectual Creation (copyright, industrial property right, right to take part in cultural life);
- V. Right to Justice (general notions, court in connection with justice, independent of judiciary, constitutional judiciary, court practice and role of courts, international and domestic arbitration, international relations and justice, European Union law, legal protection of refugees and displaced persons);
- VI. Right to a State Ruled by Law (rule of law theory, governance and lack of governance of a state ruled by law in practice).

The participants to the Competition may obtain information regarding the results around October 20, 2010.
